I. **Welcome** Adam Haynes opened the meeting at 4:00 P.M.

2. **Approval of minutes of the previous meeting** The minutes were approved as presented with no corrections. Motion to approve was made by Meggan Manlove and seconded by Bruce Wiley.

3. **Additions or changes to the agenda** Alex would like to do an update for SR2S.

#### COMMUNICATIONS

##### 4. **Project Updates**

- Alex- The Nampa and Caldwell Safe Routes to School programs will be combined under the YMCA due to a TAP grant beginning next summer. (TAP- Transportation Alternatives Program)
- Karla- TAP funding has also been approved to close the gap of the Indian Creek Pathway east of Sugar.
- COMPASS is working on creating an interactive map of bike/ ped facilities and projects in the Treasure Valley.

- The Nampa/ Meridian Irrigation District voted against allowing the planned pathway along the lateral canal for the new Copper River Basin subdivision near Lake Lowell and Middleton Roads. This is due to concerns over district maintenance access.

5. **Traffic Calming Pilot Program (tentative)** - Some of us heard hints of this program and asked for more information. Tom Points came to explain that Midsummers subdivision in North Nampa has asked about the possibility of doing some traffic calming in the area due to safe speeds being exceeded. Tom explained the various methods of slowing down traffic as well as what it takes from the city and home owners to get this in place.

#### 6. **Invest Health Initiative and August 6th Community Resource and Health Fair**

- Karla- Nampa has received a grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to invest in low income areas to see how development and healthcare can work together to improve health outcomes. Ours will focus on the north-central Nampa area. (see attachment)
- On Saturday August 6th there will be a resource and health fair at Lakeview Park to provide some basic health services, information and give north Nampa residents an opportunity to voice their concerns on a survey form. Lunch will also be served.

#### OLD BUSINESS

7. **1st St North Underpass Access.** With the 1100 block of 1st St North being a one-way street heading east, it was discussed how we could best accommodate cyclists riding west to access the Multi Use Pathway on east side of the 11th Ave underpass. After much discussion it was moved that the committee recommend a contra flow bike lane on the south side of 1st St N from 12th to 11th aves N. Motion made by Bruce Wiley and seconded by Adam Haynes. Layout is to be determined.
