



12TH AVENUE SOUTH PEDESTRIAN SAFETY PROJECT

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

In response to a high number of accidents over recent years, including bicycle and pedestrian injuries, the city will install High Intensity Activated Pedestrian Beacon (HAWK) crossings on 12th Avenue South at 11th Street South and Sherman Avenue. Construction will also include street lighting, signage, striping and pedestrian ramps.

CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

The impact of this construction project should be minimal and, although minor inconveniences may occur, your patience is appreciated.

While the contractor works on pedestrian ramps the adjacent travel lanes will be shifted to one side of the road. Shifting the lanes will convert the center turn lane into a through lane. Construction work will also prevent pedestrians from crossing on the south sides of Sherman Avenue and 11th Street South at 12th Avenue South.

The roadway will be closed for two nights, one night at each location, to install mast arms for the signals. Traffic will be detoured to adjacent streets during these one-night closures.

FUNDING

The city received federal funding through the Local Highway Technical Assistance Council's Safety Program for this project.



TIMELINE

Construction will start early March and, barring unforeseen complications, should be complete by mid-May.
