



REPORT A SPILL OR ILLEGAL DUMPING



All storm drains in Nampa lead directly to groundwater and local water bodies such as Indian Creek, Mason Creek, Wilson Creek, and the Boise River.

Substances such as automotive fluids, paint and household chemicals are bad for our waters! If hazardous substances are spilled into storm drains they may end up in the water we drink and enjoy for recreation.

Polluted stormwater can impact public health, harms fish and wildlife, kills vegetation and makes Nampa's waterways unsafe for swimming or fishing.

You can reduce pollution in our storm drains. A few easy changes to start with are:

- Properly dispose of hazardous substances at facilities that have a permit to do so
- Educate your family and friends about how and where to dispose of hazardous substances
- Never dump, wash or sweep anything into a storm drain
- Wash your vehicle at a car wash instead of the driveway
- Recycle used motor oil
- Dispose of hazardous household chemicals properly
- Water your lawn wisely and reduce the amount of fertilizer and pesticides
